# Tinicum Township Board of Supervisors Meeting Minutes May 2, 2023

Supervisors Eleanor Breslin, Jim Helms and Richard Rosamilia were present with Township Manager Teri Lewis, Police Chief Nicole Madden, Public Works Director Doug Skelton and Township Solicitor Steve Harris. The meeting, held in the Tinicum Township building meeting room, was live-streamed on Zoom and recorded. There were approximately 12 people present and 7 viewed online.

Chairperson Helms called the public meeting of the Tinicum Township Board of Supervisors to order at 7:30 PM, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### A. Old Business

# Headquarters Bridge Update

The Board announced that Tinicum Township was not selected for the Economic Development Initiative (EDI) Grant. The Board will continue to explore temporary bridge opportunities.

The Board said a proposal had been received from Doug Bond of McMullan Associates to investigate the condition of the exposed bridge masonry, prepare a draft report of the findings and provide recommendations for a temporary bridge foundation and/or bridge rehabilitation at an estimated cost of \$14,320. A proposal was also received from Chris Weaver Excavating to excavate test sites at an estimated cost of \$21,510. The Board stated that the costs for exploratory investigation and excavation would be paid for by the Woodtiger Fund.

# Motion to approve the McMullan Associates proposal at an estimated cost of \$14,320 and the Weaver Excavating proposal at an estimated cost of \$21,510.

# 2022 Real Estate Tax Waiver of Penalty Forms and Procedures

The Board stated that a 2022 real estate tax waiver form is available at the Township for those who feel that they have been incorrectly penalized due to processing problems. Forms will be forwarded to the County to determine if relief from real estate tax penalties should be granted.

# **Grant Subcommittee**

At the previous meeting, the Board discussed the idea of a subcommittee that would develop and investigate grant funding projects. The subcommittee would be comprised of a representative from each of the existing Township committees. The Board stated that not all of the committees have had the opportunity to discuss the Grant Subcommittee proposal. Further discussion will be postponed until the next Board of Supervisors meeting.

Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Program Grant At the previous meeting, the Board agreed to send an email of interest to join the regional application of the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grant Program, which seeks to add electric vehicle fueling stations in Bucks County. Subsequent

investigation into the pilot program parameters revealed that a 20% cost share would be required, the charging station must be located in a public area that is or will be made ADA accessible, and the current program appears to be in coordination solely with PECO/Philadelphia Electric. Consequently, the Board determined that the program was not applicable for the Township at this time.

#### Sewage Management Amendment

The Board stated that the proposed Sewage Management Ordinance amendment seeks to clarify that a soil-based reserve sewage area is not required when a failed system is replaced with an on-lot system.

# Township Building Addition Design Proposal

Lewis presented the Board with a proposal received from Sullivan Building & Design Group to design and draft building plans for an addition to the Township building offices at an estimated cost of \$4,000. Lewis noted that she had contacted three design firms for estimates, but had only received a response from Sullivan Building & Design Group. The Board noted that funding had previously been budgeted for this year.

# Bucks County Conservation District Dirt and Gravel Road Announcement

Public Works Director, Doug Skelton announced that the Bucks County Conservation District has approved \$146,065 in dirt and gravel road funding to improve Tankhannen Road. The selected surface material is a Driving Surface Aggregate (DSA).

#### Refurbished 2004 Mac Truck

Lewis stated the following: 1) that as a federally funded grant the bridge would have to be built to the two-lane Federal Highway standards; 2) federal funds are currently designated for the bridge, consequently funds could not be set aside for the same bridge; and 3) a 20% match would be required from the Township.
